Lit Tip

Learning the concept of object permanence is an important developmental step. Babies test this idea through games like hide-and-seek and peekaboo.

Clap Your Hands

(sung to “Row, row, row your boat”)

Tube Time

Observation & Discovery, Large Motor Skills, Object Permanence

Toy Delivery Tube

Gather a cardboard tube and several of your child’s small, colorful toys. Seat your child on the floor, place one end of the tube at his feet, and raise the other end of the tube at an angle. Place one of the toys into the top of the tube.

Leg Chute

Tape a paper towel tube to the leg of a table and let your child drop small toys into the top of the tube and watch them come out the bottom.

You could also tape a long tube to the banister or tubes of different sizes to the wall using painter’s tape.
