See the instructions below to make your own egg carton animal at home.

Supplies You'll Need:

- Egg carton(s)
- Pipecleaners
- Googly eyes
- Coloured paper
- Glue
- Scissors
- Paint or Markers



Note:

We have listed below the instructions for a ladybug, caterpillar, and bee - but the possibilities are endless! Follow the instructions for the animals below or make your own - a crab, fish, frog, penguin, or even your own made-up creature!

See the instructions below to make your own egg carton animal at home.

Very Hungry Caterpillar:

- 1.Grab your egg cartons! For the caterpillar, try to choose one of the bigger pieces in your bag.
- 2. Paint the carton any way you like! Try different colors and patterns!
- 3. Let the paint dry, and then glue the googly eyes to make the face of the caterpillar. You can also draw on the eyes or a mouth!
- 4. Next, cut your pipe cleaner into small pieces to make the legs. Glue them to the inside of the egg cartons. You can also make some pipe cleaner antennas!
- 5. Tada! Your very own caterpillar friend.









See the instructions below to make your own egg carton animal at home.

A Lady-Bud!

- 1. Grab a single egg carton, or cut one from a bigger piece.
- 2. Carefully cut around the edges of the carton to make it round
- 3. Paint your ladybug! Cover the whole carton in whichever color you would like.
- 4. Let dry, and then paint or color some polka dots on the back.
- 5. Once it's dry, glue two googly eyes on its face and then glue two small pieces of pipe cleaner to make its antennas!

Did you know? Lady bugs come in many different colors! Most commonly red, orange and yellow! The bright color helps protect them from predators by making them think they are poisonous.










See the instructions below to make your own egg carton animal at home.

Nature is bee-utiful!

- 1. For a bee, you can play around with how many egg cartons you want.
- 2. Paint your egg carton(s) yellow, then after it is dry you can paint or draw on the black stripes.
- 3. Cut out two teardrop shapes from your white paper and glue them on the bee's back to make wings.
- 4. Cut out some small pieces of pipe cleaner and glue them on to make the legs and the antennae.
- 5. Glue on your googly eyes, add your finishing touches, and voila!

Fun fact: Honey bees visit approximately 2,000 flowers a day to gather pollen! Plant lots of colorful flowers in your garden to attract

them!









CRAFT CORNER!



See the instructions below to make your own recycled robot at home.

Supplies You'll Need:

- Recycled materials
- Glue (hot glue is best, ask an adult for help)
- Scissors
- Decorating supplies (stickers, markers, glitter, paint, etc)

Instructions:
