














Activity Can Can

Motor Skills, Observation & Discovery, Visual Discrimination

NESTING CANS

Oather three or more empty fruit or vegetable cans of different sizes. Place masking tape around the lip of each an to cover any sharp edges. Show your child how the smaller cans can nest within the larger cans, and encourage him to nest all of the cans.

Show him/her how to build a tower by stacking the cans on top of each other.

Talk with your child about the differences in sizes while you sort the cans from biggest to smallest.
