We may duck behind chairs and fake terminal illness to avoid conflict in real life, but when we're creating it on the page, conflict is a storyteller's best friend. And what's a story without a good (bad) nemesis and a healthy dollop of chaos?

Through discussion and writing exercises, we'll dig into the energy these nasty but necessary elements add to every story, and the ways you can harness these forces of evil for your own nefarious writerly purposes.



Leslie Greentree is the author of two short story collections: *Not the Apocalypse I Was Hoping For*, which was shortlisted for a High Plains Book Award, and the award-winning collection *A Minor Planet for You*. She has written two poetry books: *go-go dancing for Elvis*, which was shortlisted for the 2004 Griffin Prize for Poetry, and *guys named Bill*. Leslie is also an occasional essayist and playwright, and is currently working on a novel.
